Due-Out: ID Card Check Procedures at Access Control Point (ACP) and Trusted Traveler

Update: Department of the Security Guard (DASG) conducts ID card checks in accordance with Standing Operating Procedures (SOP) to include random 100% ID Card checks.

Trusted Traveler: Uniformed Service Members and spouses, DoD employees with a valid CAC, and retired Uniformed Service Members and spouses may vouch for occupants in their immediate vehicle.

Trusted Traveler not authorized for military dependents (except spouses), contractors, volunteers, or Family care providers.

Trusted Traveler vehicle occupants are subject to random 100% ID card checks.

Trusted Traveler responsible for the actions of all vehicle occupants and for meeting all security requirements for entering the installation.

Way ahead: Continue to monitor Security Guard performance and enforce Trusted Traveler standards.

Due-Out: Sidewalk Curbs and Running/Walking Routes on Fort Lee

Update:

Sidewalks/Curbs:

- All new and repaired sidewalks are installed to meet current Anti-Barrier-Act (ABA) guidelines
- Sidewalks are identified for repair/replacement through area surveys or by installation safety and/or community members
- Repairs are programmed and performed when funding is available. Safety related repairs are prioritized and executed as soon as conditions permit

Pedestrian Walk/Run Routes:

- Generally, walk/run routes are individually defined through use of interconnecting sidewalks
- An active ~1.1 mile walking trail is available near housing. Various fitness tracks and the Petersburg Battlefield, accessible off of Mahone Ave, are also available
- NOTE: Pedestrian paths are being incorporated into all future Fort Lee Area Development Plans


