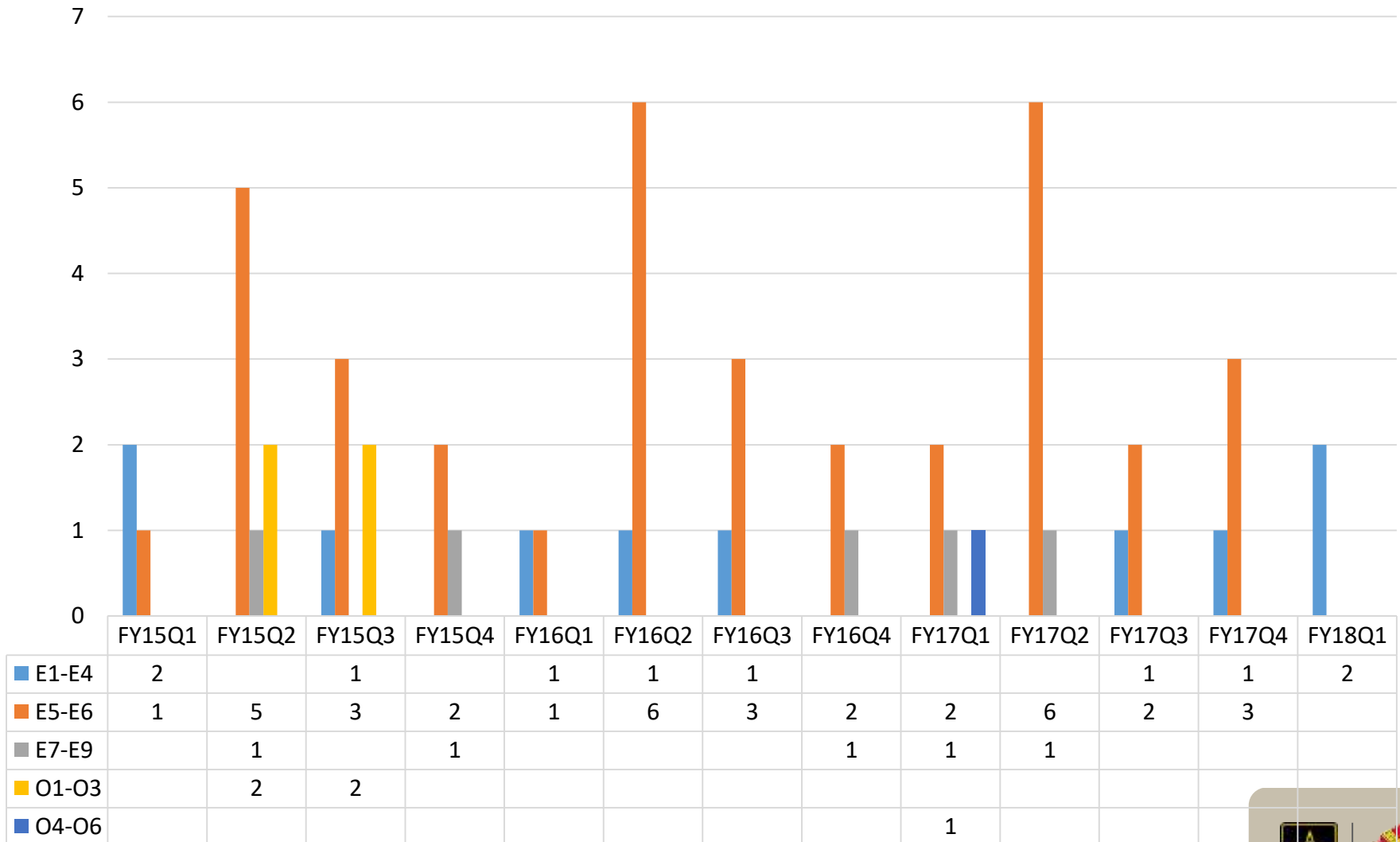

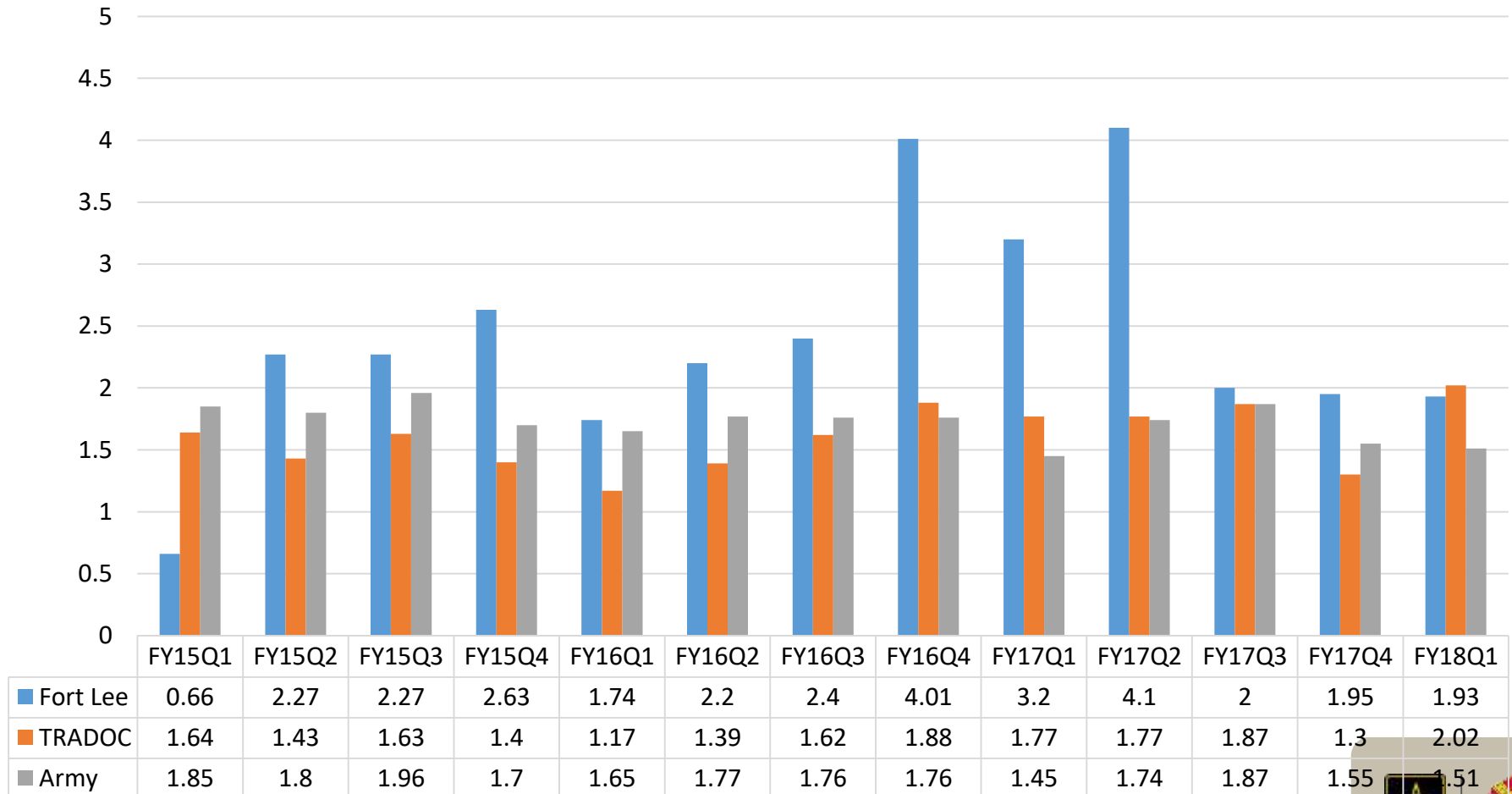

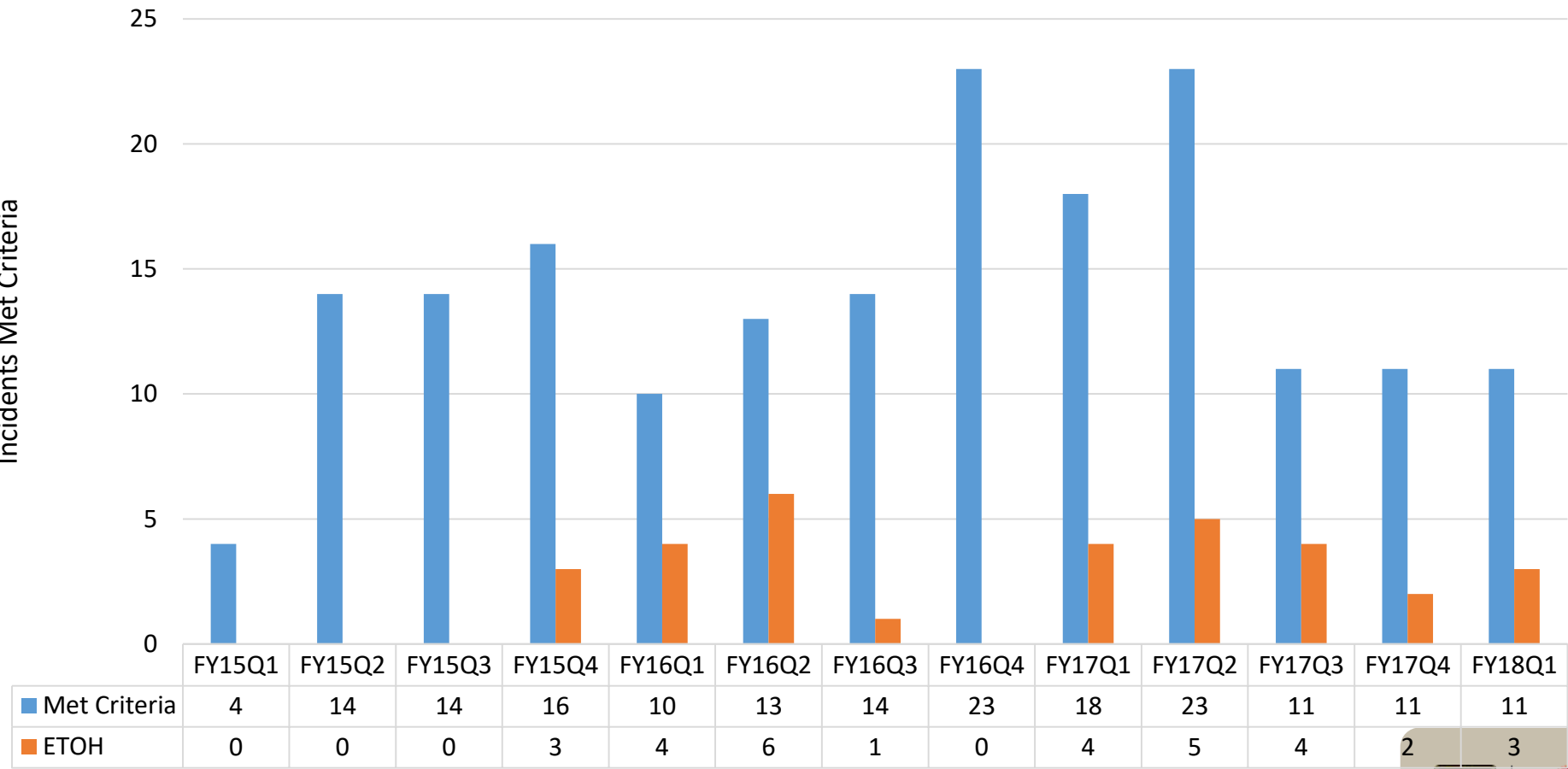




Child Abuse Incidents Met Criteria W/ Alcohol Involvement – FORT LEE

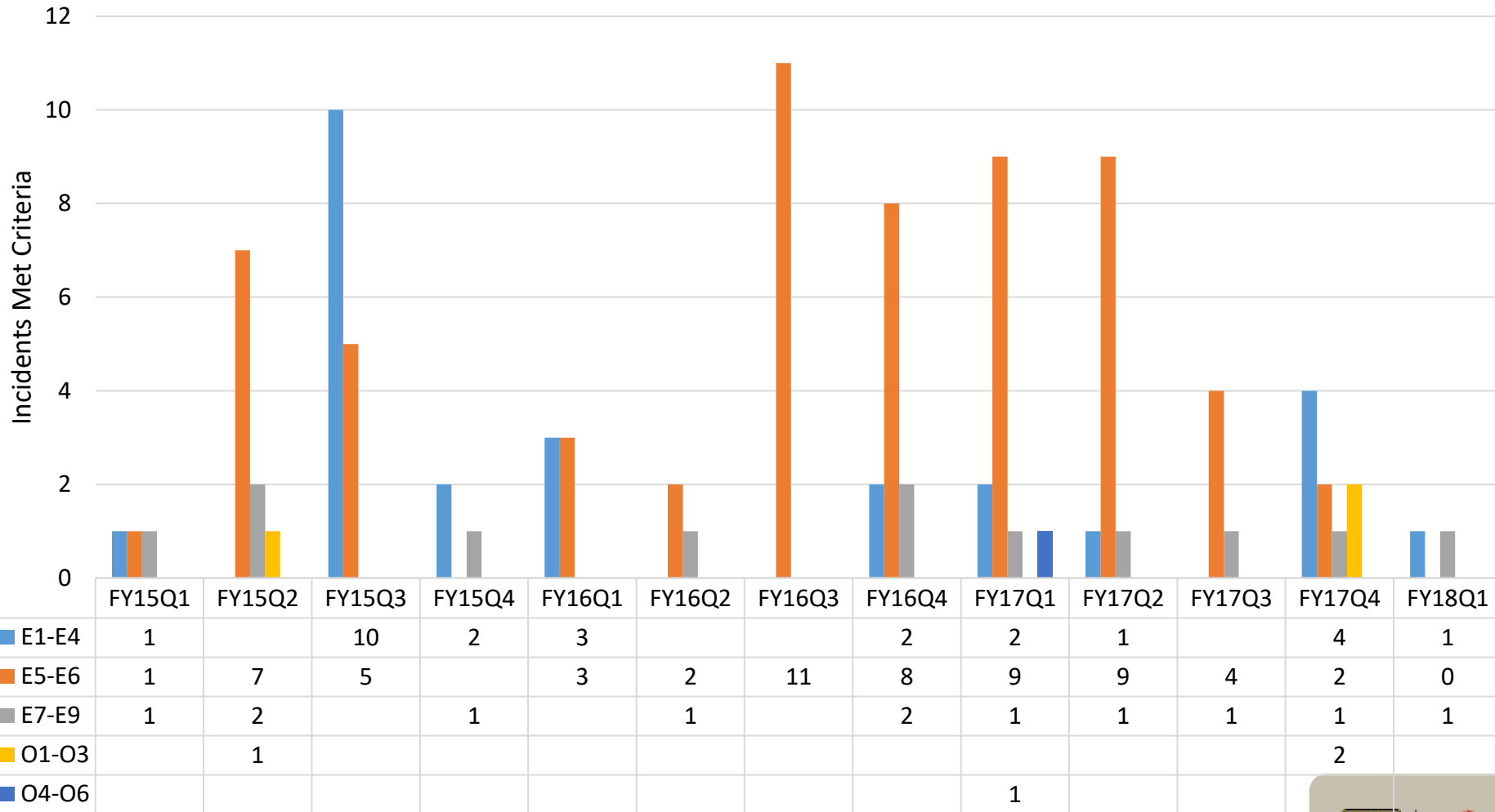

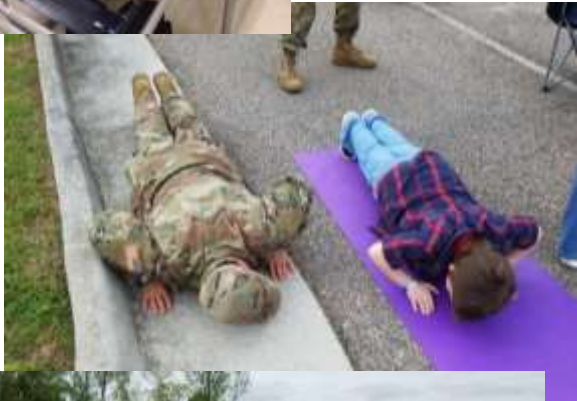
