

DUALENROLLMENT

- Pre-requisites: specific to each course typically based on previous courses in the subject area or experience in honors courses
- Weighted Grades: A+ = 5.5; A = 5.0; B+ = 4.5; B = 4.0; C+ = 3.5; C = 3.0; D+ = 2.5; D = 2.0
- Cost: some courses require tuition payment or textbook purchase
- Benefit: students earn college credit while in high school
- Some dual enrollment credit transfers as elective credit rather than content credit; some schools do not accept DE credit or limit the number of credits a student can transfer.









Advanced Placement

Pre-requisites: A or B in previous honors or AP course; A in previous regular course; teacher recommendation; PSAT scores as a prediction of potential success

Weighted Grades: A+ = 5.5; A = 5.0; B+ = 4.5; B = 4.0; C+ = 3.5; C = 3.0; D+ = 2.5; D = 2.0

Cost: Students pay approximately \$95 per exam

Score on comprehensive exam in May could earn the student college credit

Non-Housing Service Orders - Phone (804) 451-1914

- Unscheduled work used for services, maintenance, and repairs in response to customer requests
- Desk open 24 hours/day, 7 days/week and holidays
- Response Standard:
 - Priority 1 Service Order: Emergency
 - · Action is required to eliminate life threatening hazards or to prevent loss of Gov't property
 - Respond 30 minutes within duty hours or 1 hour after hours; mitigate emergency same day
 - Priority 2 Service Order: Urgent
 - · Failure in service does not immediately endanger personnel or property, but would soon inconvenience or affect the security, health, or well-being of personnel.
 - Complete within 7 business days
 - Priority 3 Service Order: Routine
 - Work that does not meet the criteria of emergency/critical or urgent priority
 - Routine, schedule completion within 30 days

Work Orders - Submitted by designated representative through DA Form 4283

- Repair, maintenance, renovation or new work "projects" or services that exceed SO capability




